Dear Qld Dept of State Development, Infrastructure and Planning,

A single state planning policy and the coordination of state interests through a centralised state assessment and referral agency are very worthwhile proposals and are arguably long overdue. The draft State Planning Policy addresses a large number of areas that will impact on all sectors of the economy.
